PROGRESS	CHALLENGES

I	Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (ACGR): Oklahoma reported ACGR for the first time in 2013, of 84.8 percent.	The ACGR for Oklahoma needs to increase 0.74 points per year starting in 2013-2014 to reach 90 percent by 2020.
II	The Class of 2012-2013 had 35,786 graduates.	The Class of 2020 needs 2,194 more graduates than the Class of 2012-2013 to reach 90 percent in this state.
III	2 fewer dropout factories in 2013 than 2002.	In 2013, there were 13 dropout factories in Oklahoma. To reach 0 by 2020, 2 schools need to improve per year.* *If the state has 7 or fewer dropout factories, 1 is assigned for 2013-2014.
IV	7,467 fewer students attended dropout factories in 2013 than in 2002.	9,524 students still attend dropout factories in 2013.
V	79.7 percent of low-income* students graduated high school on time in 2013. *In this context, low-income is defined as the percentage of students eligible for free- or reduced-price lunch.	88.7 percent of medium and high income students graduated high school on time in 2013, leaving an "opportunity" gap of 9 percentage points.
VI	Percent of 4th-graders testing at or above proficient in reading (NAEP) increased from 26 percent to 30 percent, from 2003 to 2013.	34,073 4th-graders still not proficient in reading.
VII	Percent of 8th-graders testing at or above proficient in math (NAEP) increased from 20 percent to 25 percent, from 2003 to 2013.	35,484 8th-graders still not proficient in math.

VIII

The number of students who took at least one AP exam during high school increased 6.1 percentage points, from 16 percent to 22.1 percent, from 2003 to 2013.

Only 15.2 percent of test-takers scored at least one "3" or higher.

Oklahoma first reported ACGR in 2013.
