



#### **Avoiding Data Fatigue**


- Not all data is created equal—focus on PREDICTIVE
  DATA
- More is not better—focus on ACTIONABLE DATA
- Data tracking/analysis should match action—focus on IMPACT
- Tracking data and analyzing data is not the same thing as action—FOCUS



#### **EWI Meetings**

An interdisciplinary team meeting to coordinate, create, and monitor interventions for students who are exhibiting early warning indicators



### **Types of EWI Meetings**

- Interdisciplinary team of four teachers
- Student Support Team: counselor, 9<sup>th</sup>-grade representative, administrator
- Whole-School Team: smaller school settings






### **Team Meeting Roles**

- Recorder: Fills out action plans
- Timekeeper: Ensures that timing for protocol is being followed
- Facilitator: Ensures that norms for protocol are being followed
- Everyone: Is prepared to discuss details about their students, aware of the resources available, and looking for solutions

# **Initial Meeting**



### **Agenda**

- Overview of the meeting (5 minutes)
  - Students to be discussed, new pieces of data, reminders about paperwork
- Discussing students and interventions (25 minutes)
  - Same process for each student/issue, typically 4–7 min. per
- Announcements (5 minutes)
- Sharing successes—one from each group (5 minutes)





#### Intervention Identification Protocol

- Identify student/group/issue (1–2 minutes)
  - Identify which off-track behaviors the student(s) exhibit(s)
  - Identify data-supporting identification for intervention (from EWI report)
- Team provides information (2–3 minutes)
  - Team members succinctly (monitor your airtime) provide additional information about why off-track indicators may be present
- Team members discuss intervention options (3–5 minutes)
  - Consult resource map
  - Discuss who will champion follow up
  - Determine date for follow-up conversation
  - Determine communication with family or families





### Process that Meets the Intervention **System**

- Level 3: Individual—case managed and case studies
- **Level 2**: Targeted—student roster broken down by groups based on demographics, special needs, teachers, grade level, etc.
- **Level 1**: Everyone—charts, graphs, and other data visualizations

- Level 3: Individual—case managed and case studies
- Level 2: Targeted—student roster broken down by groups based on demographics, special needs, teachers, grade level, etc.
- Level 1: Everyone—charts, graphs, and other data visualizations
